### **FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK . . . .**

Now that we seem to be back in full swing, including our new Mass schedule and our Faith formation program, it is time to "tweek" it just a bit.

I understand things went rather well on the Sacred Heart Campus this past week. In the near future you will see a bit more attention to the car line as well as reminders not to park in Catherine House's lot. I think there is a plan in the works to make "pick up" a little smoother after class as well. All in all, I think most were pleased with bigger classroom spaces in a spacious building that provided for our Faith formation needs. Thanks to teachers and parents especially who are willing to be "flexi-church" in this regard.

This last weekend also marked the return of Children's Liturgy of the Word. We thought we would try it at 9:45 and 11:30 AM. However, it seems it would also be a value at 8:00 AM Mass. So, beginning this week we will initiate our Children's Church program at the 8:00 AM Sunday Mass as well. In order to keep it going at 9:45 AM, however, we need adults willing to serve as coordinators/catechists. We will gladly train you but without more adults we will not be able to continue this children's service at the 9:45 AM Mass. The 11:30 AM Mass has a solid team of adult leaders and a growing number of children.

We may actually be within weeks of the front parking lot being expanded. I know I said it would happen over the summer but this is one of those events where even the Fall is "close enough for church work!" We are awaiting permit approval and then we will be able to move on additional space in our front parking lot!

We are also still looking for a parish member who will be in Saturday's Eucharistic Procession and carry our parish banner. We have added automatic hand sanitation stations at the church doorways (the main doors in the narthex and outside the Sacristy and Cry Room area) and outside the nursery. While we encourage you to make your best judgments about health as flu season approaches and we cope with the seasonal flu as well as the potential of H1N1 flu, we hope this added precaution will assist you as you enter and exit the church. They will remain in these areas until the early Spring. Could I ask parents to instruct children in their use so they remain a tool for good health and not a plaything? Thanks!
