## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

As I mentioned last weekend, we are called to participate in the radical hospitality of God. Practically that means we must be open to people who are different from ourselves as well as the different expressions of the faith that we share. It also means we must do what we can to welcome the stranger.

We do that in a variety of ways including our ministry of hospitality. As I mentioned on Sunday, we have put together a team of folks who will be present to and walk with our new members so they no longer feel like strangers among us. I see the new families who come to coffee and doughnuts and stand by themselves in the corner with no one to talk to them. Part of God's hospitality is always having the attitude of welcome: cracking out of our comfortable shell and reaching out to new faces, new folks and new possibilities.

All of us are called to a level of openness that makes us "invitational," that is, open to receive others into our parish life. I used three symbols last Sunday that help focus this particular reality: a bottle of wine - for joy, and loaf of bread, for nourishment and plenty and a container of salt, recognizing the tears of joy and sorrow we share together in community. As we begin now to give these "gifts" to new members, ask yourself how you might also open yourself and be gift to folks you meet on Saturday or Sunday that you do not know. What will it take to accept God's gift from them and offer your gifts in return?

Our Winter Coat Drive continues this weekend. Thank you for your generosity in this regard. We will be able to help many people stay a bit warmer this winter because of your caring.

The International Dinner you have been hearing about is simply a time to come together over the varied foods of the people who make up this religious community. We are a gathering of people from the Philippines, Vietnam, Nigeria, Latin American and South American countries, Haiti and from various European traditions. We are blessed to have an historical connection to the African American community which has settled in these parts since the second half of the 19th Century and many of whom were evangelized by the monks at Belmont Abbey and the sisters at Sacred Heart Convent and its programs in the early days of those institutions in that same century and through the 20th. We are rich in diversity. I hope we can celebrate the smells of that at this International Dinner. If you'd like to help out, look elsewhere in the bulletin. Thanks.

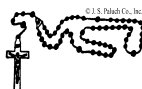
