

#### LENTEN DISCIPLINE:

The season of Lent calls the Catholic believer to a threefold rhythm of life: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. The many ministerial opportunities offered here help in the unfolding of this great preparation for Easter.

Catholics are further reminded that on the Fridays of Lent, abstinence from meat, meat products and poultry (not including eggs or meat broths and bases to soups) is a discipline for all who are not limited by age or illness, or those who care for the sick.

Further, on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday along with the abstinence defined above, Catholics from age 14 through 59, who are in good health and not limited by sickness, age or those who care for them, are called to fast. That means, one full meal may be taken on those days and two smaller meals with no food between them.

#### STATIONS OF THE CROSS:

Walk the Stations of the Cross with our Deacons in person in the church. Because of the constraints of our cameras, Stations will not be LiveStreamed.

#### SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION:

The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be offered during Lent at the regularly scheduled times on Sundays 8:15-8:45 AM, Mondays 8:00-8:30 AM, Fridays 7:30-8:30 AM and Saturdays 3:30-4:30 PM.

#### CRS RICE BOWLS:

As in past years, our parish will participate in the Catholic Relief Services Rice Bowl project a faith in-action program that invites us to encounter the needs of the world with the hope of the Resurrection. Rice Bowls will be available in the Gathering Space of the Church.
