From the Pastor's Desk

Every November, the Church turns her gaze toward eternity. The month begins with **All Saints' Day**, when we rejoice in those who already share the glory of heaven (cf. Revelation 7:9–17), and continues with **All Souls' Day**, when we remember and pray for those still being purified in God's mercy (cf. 2 Maccabees 12:44–46). Between those two observances stands the heart of our Christian faith: the hope of the resurrection of the dead.

For St. Paul, this hope is not vague or sentimental. It is the solid ground on which everything else rests. "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is in vain" (1 Corinthians 15:17). But because Christ has been raised, our own resurrection is made possible. His victory over death was not for Himself alone—it was for us. "Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep" (1 Corinthians 15:20).

All Souls' Day reminds us that those who have "fallen asleep" in Christ have not disappeared. They await the same transformatión we await: "the redemption of our bodies" (Romans 8:23), the renewal of all creatión (Romans 8:19-21), the fullness of life in God. For Paul, this is not the survival of a ghostly soul but the raising of a glorified person—body and spirit restored, transfigured, and made like Christ. "He will change our lowly body to be like His glorious body" (*Philippians 3:21*).

That promise gives meaning to our prayers for the dead. When we commend our loved ones to God's mercy, we are not simply remembering the past—we are looking forward to the future. Our prayers, our Masses, and our sacrifices of love mysteriously figure in that great work of redemption, hastening the day when all will be made new (cf. 2 Peter 3:13). The souls we pray for now are destined for resurrection; they are being prepared for the same glory we hope to share.

St. Paul describes creation itself as "groaning in labor pains" until that day comes (Romans 8:22). Death, then, is not the end but the threshold; purgatory, not punishment but purification; resurrection, not resuscitation but rebirth into everlasting life. "If the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, then He who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also" (*Romans 8:11*). The Spirit who sanctifies us now will one day raise us into the joy of the Kingdom.

All Souls' Day, therefore, is a day of hope. We grieve, but "not as those who have no hope" (1 Thessalonians 4:13). We pray, trusting that the Lord is faithful to complete the work He has begun (Philippians 1:6). And we live in the confidence that love is stronger than death (Song of Songs 8:6), that mercy is greater than judgment (James 2:13), and that every soul redeemed by Christ will one day stand radiant in His light.

Our resurrection—and theirs—is not wishful thinking. It is the promise sealed in the empty tomb. The saints in glory, the souls in purification, and we who still walk by faith all share one destiny: to rise with Christ and live forever in the life of the world to come.

"When Christ your life appears, then you also will appear with Him in glory." (Colossians 3:4)



noticias de nuestra comunidad hispana

Desde el escritorio del Párroco

Cada mes de noviembre, la Iglesia dirige su mirada hacia la eternidad. El mes comienza con la **Solemnidad de Todos los Santos**, cuando nos alegramos por aquellos que ya comparten la gloria del cielo (cf. *Ap 7,9-17*), y continúa con la **Conmemoración de los Fieles Difuntos**, cuando recordamos y oramos por quienes todavia son purificados en la misericordia de Dios (cf. *2 Mac 12,44-46*). Entre estas dos celebraciones se encuentra el corazón de nuestra fe cristiana: la esperanza en la **resurrección de los muertos**.

Para san Pablo, esta esperanza no es algo vago ni sentimental. Es el fundamento sólido sobre el cual descansa todo lo demás. "Si Cristo no resucitó, vana es nuestra fe" (1 Co 15,17). Pero como Cristo sí resucitó, nuestra propia resurrección ya está asegurada. Su victoria sobre la muerte no fue solo para Él, sino también para nosotros. "Cristo resucitó de entre los muertos como primicia de los que murieron" (1 Co 15,20).

El Día de los Fieles Difuntos nos recuerda que quienes "duermen en Cristo" no han desaparecido. Esperan la misma transformación que nosotros: "la redención de nuestro cuerpo" ($Rm\ 8,23$), la renovación de toda la creación ($Rm\ 8,19-21$), la plenitud de la vida en Dios. Para san Pablo, no se trata de la supervivencia de un alma sin cuerpo, sino de la glorificación de la persona entera: cuerpo y espíritu restaurados, transfigurados y hechos semejantes a Cristo. "El transformará nuestro cuerpo miserable en un cuerpo glorioso como el suyo" ($Flp\ 3,21$).

Esa promesa da sentido a nuestras oraciones por los difuntos. Cuando encomendamos a nuestros seres queridos a la misericordia de Dios, no recordamos solo el pasado: miramos hacia el futuro. Nuestras oraciones, nuestras Misas y nuestros sacrificios de amor se unen a la gran obra de la redención, apresurando el día en que todo será renovado (cf. 2 Pe 3,13). Las almas por las que oramos ahora están destinadas a la resurrección; se preparan para la misma gloria que esperamos compartir.

San Pablo describe la creación entera "gimiendo con dolores de parto" hasta que llegue ese día (*Rm 8,22*). La muerte, entonces, no es el final sino el umbral; el purgatorio no es castigo, sino purificación; y la resurrección no es una simple revivificación, sino un renacer a la vida eterna. "Si el Espíritu de Aquel que resucitó a Jesús de entre los muertos habita en ustedes, también dará vida a sus cuerpos mortales" (*Rm 8,11*). El mismo Espíritu que nos santifica ahora nos resucitará un día a la alegría del Reino.

Por eso el Día de los Fieles Difuntos es un día de esperanza. Lloramos, sí, pero "no como los que no tienen esperanza" (1 Ts 4,13). Oramos confiando en que el Señor completará la obra que ha comenzado en nosotros (*Flp 1,6*). Y vivimos seguros de que el amor es más fuerte que la muerte (*Ct 8,6*), que la misericordia triunfa sobre el juicio (*St 2,13*), y que toda alma redimida por Cristo brillará un día en su luz.

Nuestra resurrección —y la de ellos— no es un deseo ilusorio, sino la promesa sellada en el sepulcro vacío. Los santos en la gloria, las almas en purificación y nosotros que aún caminamos por la fe compartimos un mismo destino: resucitar con Cristo y vivir para siempre en la vida del mundo futuro.

"Cuando aparezca Cristo, vida de ustedes, también ustedes aparecerán con Él en la gloria." (Col 3,4)
