### From the Pastor's Desk

In the Roman universities, the end-of-semester examinations are often administered verbally, with a student and a professor one-on-one in a classroom, as the professor grills the student about virtually any of the topics from the entire semester's worth of lectures. One of my professors, however, gave us the questions in advance, so we could prepare ourselves adequately for the examination. His reasoning was simple: at our own judgment at the end of our lives, each of us will have a 'final exam,' a series of questions asked of us by Jesus, the divine teacher. My professor then reminded us that Jesus has already given us the questions that he'll ask us: through your service to the least among you, did you give me food when I was hungry? Did you give me drink when I was thirsty? Did you welcome me when I was a stranger? Did you clothe me when I was naked? Did you visit me when I was ill, or in prison? The professor felt confident that if Jesus has given us the questions to the ultimate final exam, then he was justified in giving out the questions to his exam.

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. All of the questions that Jesus tells us that he'll ask at our judgment boil down to, "Were you merciful?" We have to realize, once again, that mercy must be the very foundation of each of our lives. For our lives to be founded upon mercy, we not only have to practice mercy but to be aware of the action of the Divine Mercy within us – conscious that there is no sin that is too big or too embarrassing or too painful to be healed by Divine Mercy.

Once we are convinced that we are loved by God, and that he offers us forgiveness for any sin, then we can put ourselves in today's Gospel story: Jesus made himself present to the disciples and showed them his hands and his side. Without shame, he showed them his wounds. There is vulnerability in mercy – this much is shown to us by Christ's wounds – but there is no shame in mercy, simply greater power to be revealed. When wounds come because of mercy, we have to remember that none of the Gospels end on Good Friday, with the unhealed wounds of Christ: the ultimate power of mercy isn't always shown until the Resurrection, when the wounds become symbols of the font of mercy, rather than painful reminders of brutality. This is what Divine Mercy does: transform sin, pain, brokenness, old wounds, and old sadness into hope. This transformation, when we allow it to take place in our hearts, makes us into a conduit of mercy, witnesses who can't help but share what the Lord has done for us. Today is the perfect day to open ourselves to God's mercy, and to bring to his wounds any of our old wounds, confident in his promise of peace.

While we live on earth, we have the opportunity to make mercy the foundation of our lives, and to show God's mercy to a tired world. This will cost us something. But what we gain is the confidence that our ultimate final exam will end, not with an A+, but with Jesus saying to us, "Well done, good and faithful servant. Come and share your master's joy."

As we celebrate Divine Mercy today, in the Church at 3:00 we will have the recitation of the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, and reconciliation until 4:00 PM. Please join us if you can!

Looking ahead to next weekend, on Saturday at the 5:00 Mass, we will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation for our parishioners. That means the Saturday Vigil will be a little bit longer next weekend! It'll be a beautiful occasion, though; all are welcome to attend.


