Reflexión

SEÑOR, QUE NO SEAMOS SORDOS A TU VOZ.

Llegó Jesús a Cafarnaúm y el sábado siguiente fue a la sinagoga. La primera acción de Jesús, después de haber llamado a los discípulos, es la de inserirse en su ambiente de vida. Estamos en Cafarnaúm, en una sinagoga, en día sábado. Jesús vive la vida de su pueblo y, como todo piadoso hebreo, también va a la sinagoga en sábado. El hilo conductor que atraviesa todo el episodio que hoy se proclama es el de la autoridad de Jesús. Esta se manifiesta no sólo en su enseñanza, sino sobre todo en su capacidad de liberar a quien ha sido atrapado por el mal. ¿Por qué el sábado? La Explicación más obvia será la que mencionamos anteriormente: en este día se frecuentaba la sinagoga. Pero Marcos al darnos esta nota tiene otra intención: para quienes en la sinagoga buscan verdaderas noticias de Dios, la liturgia del sábado debería parecerle decepcionante: se escuchaban sólo palabras de los escribas, palabras ya sabidas y sin chispa, ya sin rasgos del fuego divino. Sólo Jesús es evidenciado, ya que sólo él está en plena misión, mientras que los discípulos, por ahora, deben limitarse a seguirlo. El Jesús que aparece en Marcos entra en acción como Maestro. La relevancia del tema emerge más bien de la relación que Jesús logra instaurar con los tuyos y por los contenidos de su enseñanza. Jesús sabe muy bien distinguir la diferencia entre hablar, enseñar y vivir. Por eso vemos que Jesús con sus discípulos se dedica a enseñarles y a caminar con él y de esa forma los iba acompañando en la misión, porque de verdad el pueblo quería escuchar las verdaderas noticias de Dios, es decir, ver caminos de conversión, de misericordia, de fe, esperanza y amor. No es tanto el hablar de Dios lo que quiere saber la gente, sino las buenas noticias expresados por un verdadero discípulo de Jesús, con todo lo compromete con su testimonio de vida. El discípulo de Jesús enseña a buscar a Jesús, a caminar con él, sequirlo de verdad, y siempre listo a ofrecer su vida por encima de todo. Les invito a reflexionar seriamente sobre nuestro compromiso de vida porque para seguir a Jesús verdaderamente se requiere: un cambio de mentalidad, un cambio de actitudes y un cambio de conducta. Para llegar a esto se requiere una verdadera conversión. Basta con que miremos a los primeros discípulos: escucharon la voz del Maestro y lo siguieron. ¿Qué tendremos que dejar para seguir a Jesús? Meditemos a través de un momento de oración profunda frente a Jesús.
