noticias de nuestra comunidad hispana

Reflexión

La lectura del Evangelio según San Mateo nos presenta una historia de búsqueda y revelación. Los magos, quiados por una estrella, buscan al Rey de los judíos. Esta búsqueda simboliza nuestro propio viaje espiritual, donde la fe nos guía hacia la verdad y la luz en un mundo a menudo oscurecido por la confusión y el desaliento. La estrella que guía a los magos es un símbolo poderoso en nuestra vida diaria. En nuestra comunidad parroquial y en los movimientos apostólicos, somos llamados a ser como esa estrella, guiando a otros hacia Jesús. Nuestra vida de oración, nuestro compromiso con la justicia y nuestro amor al prójimo son las luces que brillan en la oscuridad, invitando a otros a seguir el camino de Cristo. El momento en que los magos encuentran a Jesús y lo adoran es un recordatorio de la importancia de reconocer lo sagrado en nuestras vidas. En la parroquia, cada Eucaristía, cada acto de servicio y cada momento de comunidad es una oportunidad para encontrar a Cristo. Al igual que los magos, debemos estar dispuestos a adorar y ofrecer nuestros dones más preciados: nuestro tiempo, nuestro amor y nuestro servicio. La reacción de Herodes al nacimiento de Jesús muestra un contraste marcado. Mientras los magos buscan adorar, Herodes siente temor y amenaza. En nuestro trabajo en la parroquia y en los movimientos apostólicos, enfrentamos a menudo resistencias y desafíos. Sin embargo, nuestra respuesta no debe ser de miedo, sino de confianza en Dios y compromiso con la misión de la Iglesia. Finalmente, los magos regresan a su tierra por otro camino, habiendo sido advertidos en sueños. Este detalle nos habla de la transformación que ocurre cuando encontramos a Cristo. Nuestra vida ya no puede ser la misma; somos llamados a recorrer nuevos caminos, a vivir de manera diferente, más consciente y más comprometida con los valores del Evangelio. La historia de los magos en el Evangelio de Mateo es un relato rico en simbolismo y significado. Nos invita a reflexionar sobre nuestra propia búsqueda de Dios, sobre cómo quiamos a otros hacia El, y sobre cómo respondemos a los encuentros sagrados en nuestra vida. En nuestra parroquia y en nuestros movimientos apostólicos, esta historia nos anima a ser estrellas guía, a adorar con corazón sincero y a caminar por nuevos senderos iluminados por la fe y el amor de Cristo.
