From Our Pastor

As we conclude the Christmas season, I want to thank everyone who was so generous to me at Christmas this year. I remember you all in my prayers of gratitude to God for you and for the kindness you showed to me. Thank you!

The three years of the public ministry of the Lord — from his baptism in the Jordan to the time of his passion in Jerusalem — take center stage during our journey through Ordinary Time, which begins this week. From now until Lent, and then again from Easter until Advent, we'll hear the Gospel accounts of the life of Jesus — how he lived, how he ministered.

Although Ordinary Time doesn't have an immediate and narrow focus like some of the other stronger liturgical seasons, there is still plenty to help us grow in our spiritual lives. We should pay particular attention to the way the Lord interacts with others — and the way people respond to him. The Gospels give us a window into the ministry of Jesus, and thus a great opportunity to try to form our lives always in a closer way to the teachings and example of the Lord in his life — and, by observing the way others responded to him, we can see some good examples of both what to do and what to avoid in our own responses to his calling.

Remember, Lent begins on February 14 this year — Ash Wednesday will be here with us soon!

Reflexión

HERMANOS:

Estamos comenzando un nuevo año lleno de mucha esperanza en medio de todas las adversidades que nos ha tocado vivir, en las circunstancias de cada uno de nosotros en nuestra vida. Por eso una de las frases más llamativas para el creyente es la que nos invita a pensar como hombres de fe, esperanza y amor y es esta: AQUÍ ESTOY SEÑOR PARA HACER TU VOLUNTAD. Qué bello que meditar estas palabras que ya hemos meditado durante el tiempo de Adviento cuando nos preparábamos para la celebrar la Navidad en palabras de la Santísima Virgen: He aquí la esclava del Señor, hágase en mi según su palabra. Hoy la palabra de Dios nos invita a meditar en el llamado que Dios nos hace a cada uno, así como lo hizo con sus discípulos. Ese llamado comenzó el día de nuestro bautismo cuando fuimos ungidos a ser sacerdotes, profetas y reyes. Es una oportunidad para reflexionar sobre el llamado que Jesús nos ha hecho a cada uno de nosotros para ser discípulos y misioneros. Cuando se da cuenta de la llamada especial que el Señor le dirige, responde prontamente con toda la posibilidad de su corazón: Habla Señor. El mensaje que la Palabra de Dios hoy nos ofrece, siempre es, estar dispuestos a escuchar su Palabra, descubrir su presencia, caminar con El y entregar la vida por El. Aprovechemos este comienzo de año para revisar nuestro compromiso de fe, nuestro compromiso de entrega, nuestro compromiso de generosidad para servir y sobre todo nuestro compromiso de amor a Dios y a nuestro prójimo. ¿Cómo hay que comenzar? Vida de oración, entusiasmo por conocer nuestra fe a través de su Palabra, vivencia de los Sacramentos, principalmente la Sagrada Eucaristía, vivencia de la vida de comunidad Iglesia y, sobre todo, la experiencia del amor a Dios en la cercanía con los más pobres y abandonados. ¿Crees que ellos están cerca de nosotros?
